Barrett spoke about the 2nd Quarter Eastern District meeting which was held in Columbia that he, Janet Popejoy, Jan Palmer, Jeff Sapp, and Bryan Chapman attended last weekend. Ashland Optimists were awarded third place for points earned in our class for 4th quarter and for the entire year. We were also awarded Honor Club for last year.

Barrett also announced that we are sending Trinity Schupp to Girl's State and Max Hampton to Boy's State. Max is the grandson of Connie and Cheryl Field, who are members of our club.

We will be providing a Leadership Breakfast on Thursday, April 16th at the building and need people to volunteer to cook and clean up. Please contact Barrett or Missy if you are able to help. Our speaker this morning was Bryan Bradford with Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, Tiger Camp 432. The Sons of Union Veterans group grew out of the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR), which was a group of men who had served in the U.S. Army, Navy, Marine Corps, or Revenue Cutter Service during the Civil War. In 1881 the GAR started the Sons of Veterans to carry on the traditions and in 1925, that group became the Sons of the Union Veterans of the Civil War (SUVCW).

Some of the activities that SUVCW members participate in include helping youth understand the importance of good citizenship and respect for our U.S. flag. They also work to find and preserve memorials, monuments, and graves of Union veterans and work on educating students about Civil War History.

Bryan shared that there is part of Columbia Cemetery toward the back that was discovered to be filled with black Union soldiers, many of whom no longer have markers on their graves, so the SUVCW put up a monument with names to honor those soldiers.

Bryan also talked about the fact that during the Civil War, the defenders of the area where the University is now called themselves the Missouri Tigers and when the University was looking for a mascot, they chose the Tigers in honor of those defenders.
