Amidst all the preparation for the group that rented our building later today, Barrett Glascock, Jim Green, and Shawn Steelman still served up an excellent breakfast this morning, with homemade jam brought in by Jim. We were pleased to welcome two visitors, Dylan Hale and Jason Witte, in addition to our speaker this morning.

Our speaker this morning was Julia Thompson who retired from the Dept. of Agriculture, Plant Health division in 2017. That department is in charge of making sure that no plants coming into Missouri bring issues such as fungus or viral organisms. The majority of Julia's talk was about a disease called sycamore anthracnose. She chose that to talk about because the majority of us are familiar with sycamore trees. Anthracnose has a similar root to anthrax in animals, which is a bacterial disease, but anthracnose is a fungal disorder which can cause leaf loss, cankers on branches, and bald spots in the foliage in the Spring. Julia talked about the fact that all diseases require a susceptible host, a conducive environment, and a pathogen. In the case of anthracnose, the susceptible host is the sycamore tree, the pathogen is the anthracnose fungus, but the environment required is dampness on the leaves for an extended period of time, which is why the anthracnose rarely affects the crowns of the tree where the wind keeps leaves drier.

One species of sycamore, the London Plane, is similar to our American Sycamore in several ways but is resistant to anthracnose.

When Julia was finished speaking, she drew for the Attendance drawing. Dennis Sapp, Bryan Chapman, and Alicia Lang had their chance at riches, but now the pot will have a chance to rebuild.

Because we haven't held breakfast meetings every Saturday in November and December, the months were combined for our Poker Pot, which President Jan Palmer won with three aces. She was glad to announce that "It pays to attend!"
