We enjoyed a delicious breakfast prepared by Dana Cafourek, Mike Fulca, and me. The best parts were Dana's sheet pan baked pancakes with fruit and Mike's fried tomatoes.

Our speaker this morning was Kellye McCord with Helping Hands. She was instrumental in starting Helping Hands in the southern Boone County area in 2016 after realizing that many assistance programs in Columbia and Jefferson City didn't offer assistance to people in our area. In 2019, they gained their 501(c)(3) nonprofit status, and the program grew to include Thanksgiving baskets to provide complete Thanksgiving meals to people in need. Helping Hands currently provides 25 baskets for Thanksgiving. Helping Hands also started Project Warm which provides coats, gloves, and hats for people who need them in the area and Project Christmas, which provides gifts and a new outfit to kids, as well as household goods for their families in our area.

Kellye's biggest news is that because of a donation from Veterans United Foundation, Helping Hands will be opening a storefront and moving their food pantry and clothing out of Kellye's basement into the former Lillie Lavon location on Broadway. The donation will cover rent and utilities for two full years with Debbie Snyder as manager. They plan to open Nov. 30th, so watch for the ribbon cutting!

Some of the other projects that Helping Hands is currently helping with include a gift card drive to help the family of Callie Bontz, a fifteen-month-old little girl who has been in the hospital since Oct. 18th and a gun raffle to help Adam Martin pay for medical bills after the death of his wife, Kathy, who worked at Dr. Dooley's for over 24 years and passed away on Oct. 21st after her battle with cancer.
