Ombudsman comes from a Swedish word which means representative and Aging Best serves as a representative to 170 long-term care facilities in our area. They provide free, confidential services to assure the rights of residents in long-term care, provide assistance with long term placement, as well as solving problems and complaints of residents and their families. They are not mandated reporters, but do investigate complaints and work to find solutions.

Their biggest need at this time are volunteers with a passion for service. All volunteers are provided with state training, as well as back-up from the director. If you are interested, you can call Aging Best at (800)309-3282 or go to their website at agingbest.org.
