The Optimist Board meeting was held Thursday, Aug. 11th at 7:00 p.m. Kyle Baker, Chair of the Optimist soccer program spoke about the fact that there are 325 kids signed up and games will begin next week. Kyle also talked about the fact that the soccer players from the Southern Boone Middle School and High School will dress in their jerseys on game days, similar to what the football players have done in the past, to promote the soccer program.

Governor-elect Ernie Wren attended the Board meeting and worked out details about the club and Foundation's social media presence. Ernie also spoke about the upcoming Ashland Fall Festival on Sat. After the pledge of allegiance and a prayer from Elmer, Schiefer, we enjoyed a varied and delicious breakfast, provided this morning by Chris Felmlee, Glen Sapp, and Leigh Kottwitz with egg casseroles, french toast casserole, two kinds of sweet breads, and several types of fresh fruit.

Barrett gave the Board report, then spoke about Harold Huff, a long time Scout leader, who passed away last week. Harold had three sons, all of whom earned their Eagle Scout ranking. Their Eagle projects combined to build our baseball complex. Harold's services will be held on Aug. 20th.

Barrett also spoke about the multi-class reunion for the Ashland High School and Southern Boone Consolidated High School classes of 1940-1966 that are scheduled to be held this evening. These reunions are held every three years and one of the graduates attending from the 1940 class is 102 years old! Once a class has held their 50th class reunion, they are eligible to join the multi-class reunion.
