We held our NOW (New Optimist's Welcome) meeting this morning, with a number of guests in attendance, including Eastern District Governor Lauren Dell with her two grandkids, Maddie (Clarke) and William Bloss, Heather and Ben Martin brought their children, and John and Ben Travelos brought Janeann and daughter, Callie.

John Travelos, Robert Blake, and Bern Bonderer provided a delicious burrito bar with plenty of options, plus fresh fruit and cinnamon rolls from Callie. What an incredible breakfast for this special day!

Barrett Glascock spoke about the history of the Ashland Optimist club, which was started in September of 1964. When their meeting place at Gilmore Cafe burned down, the club took some time off, but restarted in 1967 at the old Masonic Lodge building. This is when a young (19-year-old) Barrett joined with his father. In May of 1986, the club started holding Bingo at the American Legion Hall as a fundraiser. It was an excellent fundraiser and The Ashland Optimist Club also invested money with Optimist International, which earns us excellent interest to cover the scholarships we provide, even when we had to stop Bingo in March of 2020. Other things that our club has done over the years include paying the interest on the city pool and paying for the lights at the ballfield in 1986, plus providing storage during the flood of 1993.

After Barrett was finished Ernie Wren, current Eastern District Lt. Governor, got up and spoke about the many programs our club provides. These include our many sports options for kids, the Spooktacular at Halloween, Bike Safety, Fishing Derby, as well as the bike repair program that we have coordinated with the FFA on to give bikes away to students in need at Christmas. There were thirty-five bikes given the first year and, before Covid, that number had grown to seventy-five.

To finish out the program this morning, we had Lauren Dell, current Eastern District Governor and a member at the Clayton and Cape Girardeau Optimist Clubs. She spoke about the order of Optimist International, with current President Patsy Garner, and the two Vice Presidents, one of which is Lister Florence from Rolla who has been at our meetings in the past. She talked about her belief that no one is as important as the members in the clubs that make things happen for kids in their area. She also talked about her theme, which comes from the Michael Jackson song, "Starting with the Man (or woman) in the Mirror" that we have to start the change we hope to see.

After Lauren was finished, she drew for the Attendance drawing. Eric Barmann, Lisa Barnum, and Carole Iles all had their chance at riches, but they missed that (in addition to an incredible breakfast and program), so the pot will continue to grow.
