Our speaker this morning was Brenda Austin, vice president at the Southern Boone County Senior Center, located at 406 Douglas Dr. in Ashland. Bev Steelman, 2nd vice president and Ken Bishop, treasurer were also in attendance. The senior center in our area was originally started by Margaret Smith in 1978. Twenty years later, Billy Joe Sapp and his son, Mike, built the current building and the 20th Anniversary Celebration was held Sep. 19th, 2018 with a potluck dinner.

Brenda talked about all the activities the Senior Center provides, including playing pool and cards, there is a guilt group, and musicians can come in and jam on Thursdays. The second Wed. of each month is when the Business meeting is held at 1:00, the second Wed. of the month a carry-in lunch is held (or you can pay \$7 if you don't want to cook), and there is a dance every fourth Saturday. Dues are only \$10 per year, and anyone can join, though only members 50 and over can vote at the Business meeting.

The building is available to be rented when it isn't in use, but no smoking or alcohol is allowed. The Garden Club uses the building for their annual plant sale, which is coming up April 29 from 2-7 and 30th from 8-noon.
