We will be holding the Halloween Spooktacular again this year on Oct. 31st from 5:00-7:00 outside the building, with pictures being taken for the Boone County Journal on the stage. There will be a costume competition starting at 6:00, with prizes awarded that evening.

We held Bingo again on Oct. 7th, with 90 players in attendance. Bernie Bartle and Lester Gilpin sold enough event tickets to help us break even. Brenda Ravenscraft brought pulled pork in addition to our regular offerings. Leigh Kottwitz, Ken and Jeana Bishop, with Dorise and Bryson Slinker helped in the kitchen, which deposited over \$600. Because of the low numbers of players, we paid out 80% of the usual winnings.

Because the building was already rented on the third Friday of October before we restarted Bingo and because the following Friday is the Eastern District Conference, our next Bingo will be held on Nov. 4th.

This morning instead of eating breakfast before our meeting, we held our business meeting and listened to our speaker before going over to the Southern Boone High School to enjoy pancakes and sausage to support Brooklyn Smith, a local softball player who is going through cancer treatment.

Our speaker this morning was Emily Bach. She is a sixteen-year-old Junior at Southern Boone and has been in Girl Scouts since Kindergarten. She is working on her Girl Scout Gold Award, which is equivalent to the Eagle Scout Award in Boy Scouts. It requires eighty hours on a project to improve the community. Her project is a Story Walk along the half mile trail at Ashland Park. She plans to post pages from the story along the trail and will change out the stories occasionally. The pages will be laminated to prevent damage from weather. She had to speak with the Girl Scout Council in Jefferson City and the Ashland Park Board for approval. The main concern that was brought up involved mowing in the park, but the signs with the pages will be removable when she's alerted about mowing. She estimates the total cost to be around \$500 and will be doing fundraising once she gets ready to start the Story Walk.

After Emily was done speaking, she drew for the Attendance drawing. Dayton Grover, Jennifer Zagorac, and Debbie Bowden had their chance at riches, but with their absence, the pot will continue to grow.
