After a delicious breakfast from Glen Sapp and Chris Felmlee, including a biscuit & gravy casserole, Charlie Selbach introduced our speaker, Pastor Zach Haffecke, who has been senior pastor at Ashland Baptist Church since September.

Zach talked about his history, starting with growing up in Chillicothe, MO as the child of a pastor father and a mother who is still teaching. Just before high school, his family moved to Jane, MO (population 359) close to the Arkansas border, where he finished school at Anderson High School. He and his wife, Sarah, met at a church youth camp in New Mexico and have been married for almost eleven years. They have two children, Emmy and Everett..

During seminary, he completed a six-month internship in Kansas City, then was fortunate to find Vista Baptist Church in Olathe, KS where the pastor, Shane Lester, mentored Zach to grow in his ministry. He and Sarah were there for two years, before going to Waverly, MO for another four years. He shared a remarkable story about the timeline for his application and interview in Ashland just when their family was afraid they were going to have to

find a position out of the state.

Zach talked about the fact that he believes we are all broken people just trying to love God and lead others to Christ. He spoke about the importance of community and caring for those around us. His message was very powerful, and I regret that I'm not able to share his message adequately.

When Zach was finished speaking and answering questions, he drew for the Attendance drawing. Bruce Glascock had his chance at riches, but since he is still out of state, Chris Felmlee had the opportunity to say, "It pays to attend!" when his number was drawn.
