Our speaker this morning was Jenna Stiek,

Conservation (MDC) at the Boone County Nature School north of Ashland. She started with MDC in 2012 in the fisheries division, working with water quality and aquatic species in the fish hatchery system, as well as the Stream Team program.

The Boone County Nature School is on 111 acres of land donated by Hank Waters and his wife, Vicki

Conservation Educator with the Missouri Dept. of

Russell just off the 1,500-acre Three Creeks Conservation Area which includes two renovated ponds, native plant prairie, karst caves, and woodland ecosystems. Fundraising started in October 2018 but was slowed in March 2020 by Covid. Unfortunately, while things were in limbo, material prices went up. With help from MDC and Columbia Public Schools, a large outdoor pavilion with adjacent bathrooms was built, followed by a council house with three tiers of stadium seating to accommodate up to 140 students. The Nature School building will open soon and will include four classrooms, one for each of the represented ecosystems, a wet lab, a kitchen to allow field to table preparation of native foods, and a lobby to honor Missouri's conservation heroes. Staff from Columbia Public Schools and an educator from MDC will coordinate the Nature School programs, grounds, and facilities. Approximately 2,000 Columbia Public School fifth grade students will attend weeklong sessions in the Fall, Winter, and Spring, as well as one-day field trips and Summer programs for all ages. Adult volunteers will be needed as of August 23 of this year and will be given full training. For more information, you can go to their website at https://boonecountynatureschool.com.
