Since the President was not there, it was a quick meeting, but a lot got discussed, starting with the upcoming Fishing Derby and Arcie Sapp blood drives this month, and our 60th anniversary celebration in September. The FIG committee reported that the new air handlers have been installed and the ARPA funds from the County were received to pay the contractor.

The Board also voted to purchase two loads of gravel

to fill the potholes on the corner of Henry Clay, to upgrade the wiring for the Bingo monitors which haven't worked lately, to approve four new members: Becky Blue, Wes Buffington, Tabi DenHartog, and Tillie Dowd, plus to provide \$1,000 to the Future Business Leaders from Southern Boone High School to help them attend their National Leadership Conference. The FBLA did very well at the State level and will send their team to the National Leadership Conference.

Our speaker this morning was Jackie Reed from

Caring Hearts and Hands. She was introduced by

Bernie Bartel who knew her from Mel Bartel's time using their service of on-site hospice care. Jackie was a nurse in the Boone Hospital system for 34 years, retiring in 2020 from palliative care. Last May, she and Dorreen Rardin started Caring Hearts and Hands (www.CaringHeartandHand.org) to provide the best care possible for dying loved ones in a home-like environment, at no cost, during the last month of their life. They can accept two guests at a time, who are referred through hospice, and are accepted on a first come, first served basis.

Many families are incapable of providing this care at home because of distance or physical issues. Also,

there is currently a huge need for in-home care providers, which leaves nursing homes as the next option. In nursing homes, Medicare covers hospice services, but not room and board, which can be a financial stress for families. Caring Hearts and Hands can provide these services for free because they are volunteer run and sponsored by the community. They have provided care for fifty-two guests in the past year.

Their next fundraiser will be through Shakespere's on July 3rd. If you are interested, let me know and I can

provide 30% of their funds and they are a 501(c)3 charitable organization, so all donations are tax-deductible. Yearly, they do a Lights of Love Memorial event, where they line the sidewalks of Cosmo-Bethel park with luminaries that loved ones can purchase. Families also help by asking for memorial donations after a guest has died.
