As usual, Bern Bonderer, Robert Blake, and John Travlos provided an incredible breakfast this morning of breakfast sandwiches on croissants with a variety of fresh fruit. Dorise Slinker brought a young friend of Reese's.

After we had a chance to eat, Barrett Glascock shared two Thank You cards from Blaine Hargis, one of our scholarship recipients who spoke last Saturday and Lauren Hammett, last year's Oratorical winner. He also shared that we had 129 players at Bingo Friday night, with Glenda Richardson calling so that Barrett could attend graduation at Rock Bridge. Our first air handler was installed Friday and provided cool, fresh air. With \$2,100 from event games, we deposited around \$5,000. The monitors shut down and we will need to look at rewiring the system, which hasn't been upgraded in ten years. With Les Hahn's pulled pork, the kitchen deposited over \$860.

President Leigh Kottwitz shared that we have completed our slate of Officers with Tara Blue accepting the Vice President position. John Dougan has moved the date for the Fishing Derby to June 22nd after complications getting Missouri Dept. of Conservation there on June 8th. The Annual Arcie Sapp Blood Drive is scheduled for June 26th from 2:00- 6:00. We will need people to provide sandwiches and cookies, plus act as greeters that day.

Bern Bonderer shared that the drag he uses for the softball fields broke, but the school got it fixed just in time for practices, which begin Sunday.

Mary Dewey, President of the Downtown Optimist club, who will also be our Lieutenant Governor of Zone One as of next year when we drop to five zones, was our speaker this morning. She shared about a program called Grouper which may pay for your Optimist dues if you are 65 or over. (Email <u>Optimist@hellogrouper.com</u>) to see if you are eligible. They provide this benefit to help people stay socially, mentally, and physically involved. If you have already paid your dues, they will reimburse you.

She then talked about the Soap Box Derby they will be hosting on June 9th on Broadway in Columbia. She also talked about their geocaching program that they started in 2020 with the Optimist Creed. Youth are required to find each line and take a selfie of them reading it. When they find all of the lines, they send the video to the club with a chance at winning a \$50 gift card. Ten parks around Columbia were used to hide lines. The youth learn how to read latitude and longitude on a map, plus compasses to find all of the lines. This year the club used the Bill of Rights.

Mary hopes to see many of us at the Fourth Quarter Convention, which will be held in Columbia on Aug. 15-17th. Officer training will be held Sat. Aug. 16th.
